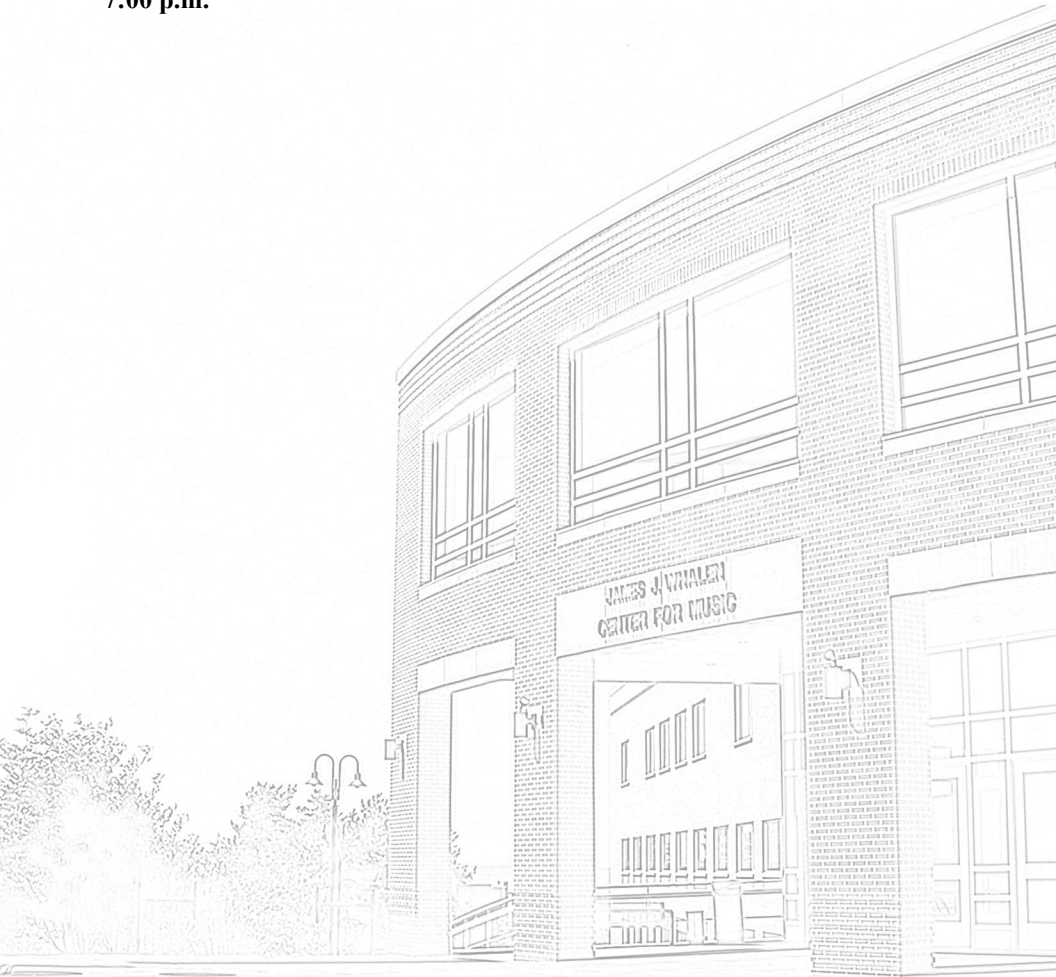

Biographies

Victor Silverstone

Victor Silverstone, also known as Viktor Kisnichenko Principal Trumpet of The Gävle Symphony orchestra (Sweden), has been with the orchestra since November 2008. At the age of 14, Victor moved to Moscow to study with Ilja Granitsky for 4 years at the Gnessina College, he then continued his education with prof. Novikov at The Moscow Tchaikovsky Conservatory for a subsequent 5 years.

While still at the Conservatory Victor Silverstone was appointed to the Bolshoj Theater and then to the Moscow Philharmonic orchestra. He is a graduate of The Gothenburg Music School with a doctors degree, having studied with prof. Bengt Eklund (1997-2001). Whilst studying he has taken lessons for and participated in master classes with many leading trumpet players and teachers such as Edward Tarr, Friedemann Immer, Pierre Tibbou, Timofei Dokshitser, Bad Herset, Phillip Smith, Armando Gitala, Vincent Chikowich, Leonard Candelaria, Marc Gould.

As a trumpet soloist Victor Silverstone has won several international trumpet competitions including Ellsworth Smith trumpet competition (1997), Moscow international trumpet competition (1995), Kiev international trumpet Guild competition (1998). During the last ten years Mr. Silverstone has worked with many symphony orchestras including The Gothenburg Symphony orchestra, The Royal Philharmonic orchestra (Stockholm), Norrköping Symphony orchestra, Gothenburg Opera Theatre orchestra, Auckland Philharmonia orchestra (New Zealand) where he spent 4 years (2004-2008) as principal trumpet.

Mr. Silverstone regularly appears as soloist, recitalist and clinician. He has performed as soloist with the Gothenburg Symphony, Auckland Philharmonia, Christchurch Symphony, Moscow Symphony orchestras. Victor Silverstone has also appeared with many wind and strings ensembles, he has been a soloist with the Göteborg Brass (Sweden) where he played principal cornet for 4 years, Viva Chamber orchestra, NZ Chamber Brass, Saratov woodwind orchestra and numerous other ensembles.

Mr. Silverstone has been on the faculty of Auckland University (2003-2007), and has appeared as recitalist and clinician at Norwegian University(Oslo),Gothenburg University(Sweden) and at several International Trumpet Guild conferences.
