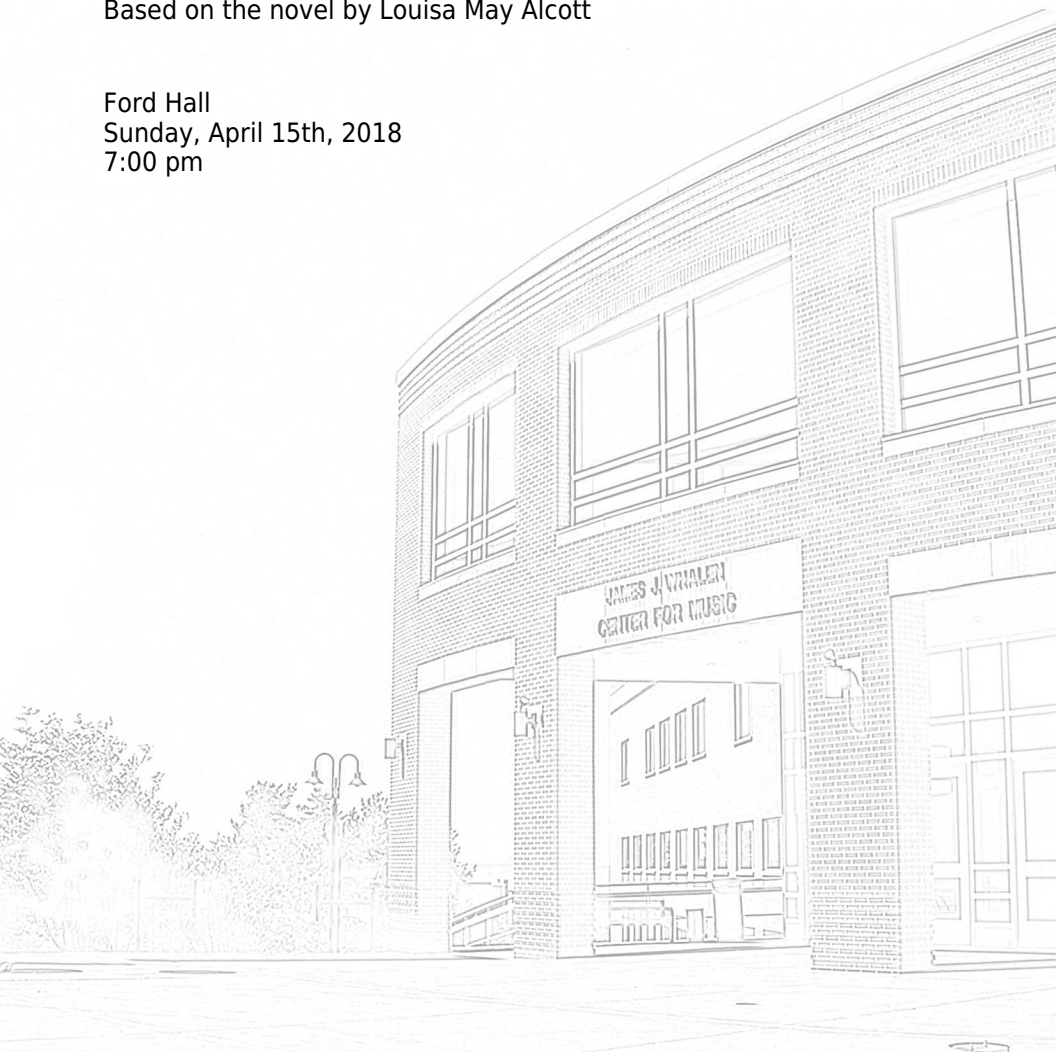

Biographies

Patrick M. Young has been working professionally since 2000 as a musical director and pianist, and has been fortunate to travel around the country working before returning to school. He served as the associate musical director on the 2007-2008 National Tour of *Peter Pan* as well as playing Keys 2. He has also worked around New York State at The Hangar, The Kitchen, Bristol Valley Theater, Cortland Repertory Theater, and has spent time in Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Michigan, and Florida for various engagements. Favorite shows he has worked on include *Parade*, *Sunday in the Park with George*, *Into the Woods*, *West Side Story*, and *Songs for a New World*. With the cooperation of the Cole Porter Estate and Trust, he arranged the musical revue *Let's Misbehave: The Music and Lyrics of Cole Porter*. In addition to his musical direction and frequent collaboration with vocalists, he has had opportunities to serve as a secondary vocal arranger and orchestrator on many productions he has musical directed. Thank you to Dawn Pierce, Jennifer Kay, and Chrystyna Dail for their mentorship and assistance in this project, and to Charlie Crawford and Dan Mullarney for their open ears.

Charlie Crawford is a space cadet. He graduated from Ithaca College last year with a degree in "Arts Leadership and Production" which essentially means nothing. He designed his degree through the Integrative Studies Department with the help of the illustrious Professor Mary Ann Erickson. He is very thankful for her guidance and wisdom. Other humans to whom he is forever indebted include Professor Dawn Pierce, Amy O'Brien, and Dr. Chrystyna "Doc" Dail.
