The women of the *Sheherazade Trio*, named for the courageous woman who told 1001 beguiling and evocative tales to save her own life, are all faculty members at the Ithaca College School of Music who first performed together in 2006.

Susan Waterbury (violin), Elizabeth Simkin (cello) and Jennifer Hayghe (piano) were trained at the major conservatories and schools of music in the United States by the top teachers of their instruments. The three musicians have extensive chamber music experience, performing at major concert halls throughout the United States, Europe, Asia and Central America.

They have also coached and performed chamber music at literally dozens of summer festivals and universities throughout the US and abroad. In their first performance of the Shostakovich Second Piano Trio at a festival celebrating the centennial of Shostakovich's birth, the chemistry between the three was undeniable, both musically and personally. They have been enjoying ongoing projects ever since.
